STANDARD PAPERS

20-minute presentations which will be published as 6-page papers in the proceedings;

STANDARD POSTERS

Standard poster presentations which will be published as 6-page papers in the proceedings;

ABSTRACT POSTERS

Poster presentations which are guaranteed to be published in the Proceedings as one -page abstracts but can be submitted only by members of the Gesellschaft für Kognitionswissenschaft.

SYMPOSIA

90 to 150 minutes of presentations which will include three or more talks on a current topic, possibly with a discussant. They will be published as one-page abstracts in the proceedings.

SUBMISSIONS

Submissions for standard papers, standard posters, and symposia will be reviewed by an international panel of experts according to the following criteria: significance, relevance to a broad audience of Cognitive Science researchers, originality; methodological quality; clarity of presentation. The necessary information with respect to technical instructions for the submissions will be available before submission deadline on the conference website.

PRE-CONFERENCE LECTURES

A program of 6 to 12 hours of lectures on different topics will be offered the days prior to the main conference.
